THE PRE-CHRISTIAN BACKGROUND

Selected Old Testament Dates (Approximate)

- 1800 BC Abraham, Patriarchs
- 1250 BC Moses
- 1050 BC Beginning of Israelite monarchy (Saul, Samuel)
- 1000 BC United Kingdom (David)
- 950 BC Solomon builds First Temple in Jerusalem
- 850 BC Elijah
- 722 BC Northern Kingdom falls to Assyria, disperse ten tribes
- 586 BC Babylonian Captivity (Southern Kingdom falls to Nebuchadnezzar)
- 538 BC Persians overthrow Babylon
- 458 BC Ezra restores worship in the temple
- 445 BC –Under Nehemiah's leadership, the walls of Jerusalem are rebuilt and completed
- 400 BC –prophetic ministry of Malachi ends (OT ends), Judea still under Persian rule

Intertestamental Period

- 427-347 BC Plato
- 384-322 BC Aristotle
- 332 BC Alexander the Great conquers Persian Empire, Greek rule of Judea begins
- 322 BC Death of Alexander the Great, Egyptian rule begins under Ptolemies
- 3rd Century BC The Old Testament translated into Greek (Septuagint)
- 198 BC Seleucid (Syria) rule
- 167 BC Antiochus Epiphanes, Seleucidian ruler, desecrates Temple in Jerusalem
- 164 BC Hasmonean (Maccabean) revolt against Seleucidian rule (celebrated by Hanukkah) Pharisees and Sadducees
- 146 BC Rome defeats the Greeks and begins expansion of its empire
- 63 BC Rome (under General Pompey) captures Jerusalem, marking the beginning point of complete Roman rule over Judea
- 27 BC The Reign of Caesar Augustus begins

THE FIRST CENTURY

New Testament Era

- 4 BC The birth of Jesus Christ and the beginning of the New Testament
- AD 29 Public ministry of Jesus
- 33 Crucifixion, Resurrection, Pentecost
- 35 Conversion of Paul (profound encounter with Christ)
- 41 Gentiles admitted in fellowship (Acts 15) with James as head of the Church
- c. 45 c. 100 Writing of New Testament
- 48 Beginning of Paul's three missionary journeys across Europe and Asia Minor (see map)
- 64 Neronian persecution begins
- 70 Jerusalem destroyed by Roman Emperor Titus, Antioch becomes center of Christianity
